

CIAC Merit Award

Cathy Inglese was selected as a recipient of a 2011 Merit Award, presented by the Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference (CIAC) Girl's Basketball Committee. This award is presented to individuals who have made a significant contribution to high school girls' basketball over the years and have supported the CIAC athletic program.

CHSCA Hall of Fame

the Connecticut High School Coaches Association Hall Of Fame. This award is a tribute to coaches who have given their time and dedication to Connecticut high school youth.

Connecticut Field Hockey Hall of Fame

Arden Curtis and Linda Dirga were inducted into the Connecticut Field Hockey Hall of Fame. This honor recognizes those who, either through participation, support, service, or achievement have contributed to the enhancement of field hockey in Connecticut.



HAPPY BIRTHDAY!!! CWBHOF TURNS 25 YEARS OLD

Twenty five years ago five friends refused to put a limit on their imagination. Their idea was simple, to honor individuals who had contributed to the enhancement of women's basketball in the State of Connecticut. The fact that no other state hall of fame existed for women's basketball in the country was not viewed as an obstacle but as an opportunity to be the first thereby setting the standard for others to follow. The "founders", Louise E. Albrecht, Linda Wooster, Dr. Ann V. Fariss, Dr. Brenda A. Reilly and Tony Candido, would go on to create the constitution and organizational framework for what would be known as the Connecticut Women's Basketball Hall of Fame (CWBHOF).

Twenty five years later the hall of fame has grown gracefully with age gaining in experience, wisdom and importance. Happy 25th birthday to the CWBHOF and best wishes for another great 25 years!

Special Recognition......

Stepping Down / Stepping Up

Following the 2011 basketball season, David Strong stepped down as head girls' basketball coach at Masuk High School. Strong was the Panther's head coach for 35 seasons and amassed quite an impressive resume. He had a state best 704 victories, appeared in the state tournament every year since it began in 1974, appeared in 7 state finals, won 3 state titles and captured 19 league championships. Strong was inducted into the National High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2009 and is a 2004 CWBHOF Inductee.

Ann Odoy will take over the reins for David Strong as head girl's basketball coach at Masuk. Odoy, a former Masuk 2,000 point scorer, was the Panther's assistant coach for 15 years. She previously coached at Boston College and Duquesne and played professionally overseas. In 1991,

Odoy was inducted into the CWBHOF and in 2008 was honored with the CHSCA Asst. Coach of the Year.

Stepping Down.....

Linda Dirga, a 2012 CWBHOF inductee, has retired as the Pomeraug High School field hockey coach after 27 years. During Dirga's tenure, the Panthers won over 400 games, captured 8 state championships and 19 conference titles including a share of the Class L state title in 2011. Dirga was inducted into the National High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame.
